
## "How to help people in need"

"Go around and ask all your neighbors for empty jars. Don't ask for just a few...They brought the jars to her and she kept pouring."

II Kings 4:3,5

A woman finds herself in a desperate situation! Her husband, a revered pastor, has just died. She has no income. Her husband had accrued a huge debt and the creditors are calling, even threatening to enslave her two sons. She calls the spiritual leader of the area. Call him the Bishop, District President, Senior Pastor, Prophet. His name is Elijah. If you were he, how would you respond? Take a special offering? Call one of your wealthy friends and explain the need?

In the Biblical account of this story, the real Elijah has even more options. He can call upon the Lord of heaven and earth to do the miraculous, to intervene in an other-worldly way, to materialize the cash and food on the spot. But Elijah does none of these. He asks the woman to involve her community. She is to send her sons throughout the community and ask for empty jars. Empty jars in the days of Elijah had

Faith and initiative, personal involvement and community support. No assistance from outside save from the Lord himself blessing the activity. The result? Oil flowed, debts were paid, the woman and her sons survived. Read the entire story in II Kings 4.

This story is an illustration and an example of how to help people in need. The temptation is to do too much too fast, to rely on those from the outside. But Elijah knows that this woman has resources she is overlooking. In her desperation and panic she answers Elijah's probing

## Fruits from Missionary Meyer Seminar

Missionaries Delano and Linda Meyer visited Kenya in February of this year and their visit was noted in our March newsletter. Just a few days ago, the farmers who attended that seminar began to harvest their maize. Many of them employed the techniques for fertilizing their crops that they learned in the Meyer seminar. Pastor Zadok of the Lutheran congregation in Emuhaya—who also works part time for Capstone reported that the farmers in his congregation are experiencing a 30% increase in yield. Pastor Zadok also mentioned that he plans to buy maize now when it is cheap and storing it to sell in a few months when the price will have doubled. This technique for self-empowerment was taught in the seminar as well. Praise God!

question: "What do you have in your house?" with the quick retort, "Your servant has nothing there at all....except a little oil." Grief and stress filled her heart. Little faith if any. No awareness that "little can be much in the Lord's hands."

Capstone staff deal with these kinds of desperate situations every day. The temptation is be merciful, solve the situation on the spot instead of trusting that the Lord wants those in need to show faith and use the gifts He has already placed there.

In May three members of Capstone attended a one week conference lead by long time missionary and friend Jody Collinge. Jody works with the poor in Mexico, employing the same principles as Elijah in a structured approach called "CHE": Community, Health, Evangelism. The focus is on linking

community-identified needs with empowerment, community involvement and the Gospel. The objective is to do more than solve problems. The approach focuses on the community analyzing and prioritizing their problems and finding ways to address them with locally available materials, not highly technical devices that depend on outside knowledge for repair and maintenance. Much like Elijah's approach to the woman's circumstance, CHE engages the individual and the community in a faith based approach that couples concepts to Biblical teaching that empowers the community at the same time. Several of these practical, Biblical lessons (pictured above) will be used in the upcoming Capstone Camp. More on that next month.
