"Land that drinks in the rain often falling on it and that produces a crop useful to those for whom it is farmed receives the blessing of God...God is not unjust; he will not forget your work...We do not want you to become lazy, but to imitate those who through faith and patience inherit what has been promised." Hebrews 6:7, 10, 12

Is it possible to be effective in mission by combining mercy activities with Gospel activities? Some would say, "Yes, it is!" Others, like veteran missionaries Delano and Linda Meyer—long time farmers from western Minnesota and former missionaries for LC-MS in Liberia and Ghana would beg to differ. In reality, when you combine hand-outs with a sharing of the Gospel, you send a mixed message. On the one hand the Gospel encourages faith, patience and trust in God's love, on the other hand the giving out of "goodies"—whatever form they may take—tells people to trust in man. The result is often confusion and

dependency; sometimes even jealousy, laziness, and division.

Delano and Linda take a different approach. They combine the message of the Gospel with personal stewardship of God's resources. The result is a people who trust God not only for their salvation but also their daily bread as a result of hard work, innovative farming techniques and family cohesiveness.

Delano and Linda been traveling all over Tanzania, Kenya and now Uganda as of this writing teaching farming techniques that help subsistence farmers to produce more, trust God and become better stewards of God's provision. This was the Meyers second visit to Capstone Ministries. We have connected them to the 50 farmers--

--mostly women—who grow moringa for Capstone. The four groups met in Maseno for the morning seminar that included inspiring testimonies from those who had applied the techniques taught by Delano and Linda last year.



These are just a few of the farmers from the 55 who attended the seminar. These farmers gave testimonies about how the techniques taught by the Meyers improved their crops.

The Meyers then spent two days visiting a farm from each group to give "hands on" advice on ways to improve. Each group met at the respective farm and gained valuable insights from this "on the ground" observation of farming techniques being practiced by the group.

God reminds us in the Hebrews Scripture quoted at the outset that he blesses hard work. The Meyers not only love this important Scriptural promise having farmed for years in Minnesota, they are teachers of this important stewardship principle.

Until recently they spent 3 years working as volunteers for <u>The Kenyan Children's Project</u>, living in community with a family, consisting of vulnerable children and Kenyan staff, and overseeing the work of the charity in and around Kakamega, Western Kenya.

Through this time Derek and Penny learnt many valuable lessons in effective cross-cultural parenting and leadership the result being a significant transformation within the home. Many of the children had horrendous stories of abuse, loneliness, rejection and addiction, but through the work of Derek, Penny and The Kenyan Children's Project (KCP), the children received hope and restoration — both physical and emotional
