"Songs of Joy"

"When the Lord brought back the captives to Zion, we were like men who dreamed. Our mouths were filled with laughter, our tongues with songs of joy." Psalm 126:1,2

John was a boy a way long from home. He had trouble communicating in the bus stage in Kisumu, the heart of luo-land. John's mother tongue was Kikuyu from Muranga, a village outside Nairobi.

John did his best to talk with the staff of Capstone and expressed a willingness to go home. But Muranga is a bus ride with several transfers—at least 8 hours and it was already late in the day. So a few nights stay was arranged with Pandipieri, a local Catholic charity Capstone works with to keep boys for a night or two when a boy is rescued late in the day.

In the meantime, Capstone staff discussed John's case at the Friday staff meeting the next day. John had told the staff that his mom had abandoned him, remarried and moved to far away Siaya and that he wanted to go back to his grandmother in Muranga. However, none of our staff was familiar with Muranga. Pastor Zadok mentioned that he knew someone from that area. A man called Chege who might be able to help. So he called Chege. Chege said, "Yes, I know Muranga, in fact I know the local chief. Come and I'll arrange to meet the chief. Certainly she will also know the family of John."

We called the chief and described the boy, where he had gone to school and the chief said she (yes, some chiefs are female) did know the family and would arrange a reconciliation with the grandmother (Hannah) and an uncle.

Pastor Isaiah set off the next day (July 10) with John to meet Chege, the chief and eventually John's grandmother. The chief was not only

willing to assist, she did so with great enthusiasm. She sat and talked with John about the family situation. It turned out John's name was actually Stephen. The actual reason he had run away was not because his mother had abandoned him. In fact, John and his 3 siblings had gone with his mom and step father to Siaya and Stephen ran away because his step father had been beating him.

When grandmother Hannah arrived at the chief's office, she broke into tears and songs of joy at the sight of her grandson. She only knew her grandson was missing

and feared the worst.

More counseling work needs to be done with this family. Plans are being made to visit the mother and step father. In the meantime Stephen has a safe, loving and secure place to live and go to school.

A few important lessons from this story:

Street boys will often fabricate stories to protect themselves, even change their real names.

Reconciliation takes a team. We praise God when people come alongside to assist in the process.

Home is always best. Extended family are most willing to take in and support family members. It is a cultural normative.

Capstone works cooperatively as a staff. It is in the open meetings on Friday that all cases but especially tough situations are discussed and solutions sought.

Look deeply at Hannah in the photo above. Do you see her joy, her humility before God, her thankfulness for a son come home? God bless you for your support of Capstone Ministries that makes all this possible!!
