"God the Builder"

"For every house is built by someone, but God is the builder of everything" Hebrews 3:4

"East, west, home is best." This proverb isn't particularly old. It first appeared in print in a collection of international proverbs by the English writer Walter Keating Kelly in 1859. Kelly introduced it as a translation of an earlier German proverb: "Ost und West, daheim das Best." The English preacher Charles Spurgeon used a variant of it in John Ploughman's Talk in 1869: "East and west, Home is best."

Regardless of the origin, it expresses the vision of Capstone Ministries as an approach to vulnerable children. One may wander far from home, but nothing is better than the place where you belong: home.

Home is more than a place to hang your hat or shelter from the storm. It is about relationship and familial ties. It does not matter if the house is palatial and filled with marble and gold or a simple mud hut with a thatched roof. The essential ingredients are the people and the Lord who brought you together.

But what happens when a house is destroyed and a simple place to lay one's head in the evening is threatened by wind and rain? In the book of James, he asks a rhetorical question about the important role between works of mercy and faith. "Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and well fed,' but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it?" James 2:15,16 Most experienced missionaries will tell you that whether to help or not with physical needs of others is not the important issue. What is important is HOW you help.

At Capstone, our focus is the spiritual aspects of reconciliation, for these are the truly lasting needs. We emphasize the need for honesty, repentance, forgiveness, and reconciliation. However, we are not blind to the physical needs of many of the rural families we work with. Last year when the pandemic struck, so did the floods in western Kenya. Many were displaced from homes and forced to take shelter in schools or any building not inundated. We did what we could through the spiritual shepherds in the area. Many were assisted who were left without food, blankets or shelter.

A number of Capstone families were also assisted with food stuffs. One family in particular reported a devastating loss. The house of Michael Magondi had collapsed and injured the single mother inside. The roof and one of the mud walls had fallen down. The staff discussed how best to assist and it was decided to help with the iron sheets needed to restore the roof.



The family, through friends and relatives raised the funds to repair the walls and treat the mother who was injured. The family is very grateful for the assistance Capstone has offered to stabilize the living environment of the family.
