

"Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord." (Ephesians 6:4)

Parental abuse is not limited to the decline of civilization in the 21st Century. It took place in ancient societies. In fact, God warned Israel not to engage in the Canaanite practice of child sacrifice to the god Molech. "You shall not let any of your descendants pass through the fire to Molech." Lev. 18:21 The Canaanites surrendered their children to the flames to appease the false got Molech that he might prosper them. Such atrocities would never be part of a civilized society, would they? Yet in an investigation in 2014 by "Channel 4 Dispatch" in the UK, it was discovered that at least 15,000 fetal remains were incinerated by 27 NHS hospitals for the purpose of providing heat and energy to the institutions. Appalling!

When a society does not value and protect its children, it is really sacrificing its future. Paul, in Ephesians 6 outlines the importance of familial relationships, particularly parents and children. Fathers in particular are charged with rearing their children in the training and instruction of the Lord. How many parents do you know who have said something to the effect: "I'll let my children decide what to believe when they are old enough." This is a blatant disregard for the responsibility God gives to fathers.

In Kenya, things are no different. An absent father in the household, either physically or emotionally, is a major cause of children running from home. God designed the family to be a unit working together, not separate entities pursuing selfish goals.

Capstone Ministries objective has, from the start, worked to bring reconciliation and renewed responsibility among families of reconciled street children. God's design for the family has the vision of the ministry. This is why we are so very strong in maintaining that home is the best place for children, not institutional care.

Capstone works alongside families to strengthen, encourage, and disciple. We do this through in home Christian counseling, 17 Bible study groups, Capstone Camp, and educational assistance.

Those children who are achieve good grades in primary school are offered a scholarship in high school. In the 2022 exams

14 children achieved high marks and were offered scholarships. Fess for secondary school run between \$250-\$600 per year so these fourteen will have an impact on our 2023 budget. From the beginning in 2005, we have strived to trust the Lord for the resources needed for our budgetary needs. We do that again this year, believing that when the Lord calls, he also moves in the hearts of his people to provide what is needed.
